



Do you want to know which NHTI courses will transfer to 4-year schools in New Hampshire? Are you curious how NHTI classes fit into a degree program at these schools? **NHTRANSFER.ORG** provides the answers! It was designed with New Hampshire community college students in mind to help answer your college transfer questions. Here are some ways you can use it to figure out which classes you can transfer.

First go to **NHTRANSFER.ORG** and click on



Choose NHTI-Concord as the “**Transfer From**” Institution and your choice of participating colleges as the “**Transfer To**” Institution. Click Submit. **You can search the database 3 ways:**

1. If you want to see if an individual NHTI course is transferable, click



Type in your course number (for example, EN101 is English Composition), then click **Go**. You can see if the course transfers, the number of credits that transfer and the minimum grade you need in order for the 4-year school to accept the credits. *Keep in mind that in almost all cases you will need at least a C to transfer a class!* Talk to your NHTI Academic Advisor about other requirements.

2. Are you curious about which NHTI General Education Elective classes fit into the different study areas at your future school?



Click on **Keyword Search** and you’ll see a list of drop down boxes. Let’s say you want to see which NHTI courses fit in the University of New Hampshire’s Social Science study area. If you choose UNH as the “Transfer To” Institution you will see the following:

Key Word Search

Transfer from NHTI - Concord to University of New Hampshire

Include *Inactive* Courses

Select one category *only*

NHTI - Concord GED: Go

University of New Hampshire GEd: Group 7, Social Science Go

NHTI - Concord Keyword: Go

NHTI - Concord Course: Go

University of New Hampshire Course: Go

Use the drop down box next to University of New Hampshire GEd and choose **Group 7, Social Science**, just like in the example above. When you click **Go**, you’ll see which NHTI courses satisfy that study area. It’s as easy as that, and it’s a great way to help you plan your NHTI class schedule.



3. Do you want to know which classes you need in your future degree program, and how your NHTI classes fit into it?

Transfer Programs

Then click on **Transfer Programs** and click the **Next >** button twice to show the list of majors. Let's pick Social Work (B.S.) at Plymouth State University (PSU). Once you click on these links you'll see:

Classes with a * in front of them, such as *SW2200 and *IS1111, will need to be taken at PSU. The classes highlighted in **red** and without a *, such as IT102, PY105 and EN101, are NHTI classes that will transfer directly into the PSU Social Work program. If you are wondering about your other NHTI classes, the ones that are transferable will be used as general education electives in the various study areas at PSU (click on the **blue** links to see which NHTI classes meet those requirements) or as General Electives (up to 24 credits in the case of the Social Work program). These are shown at the bottom of the screen.

Besides acting as a transfer credit database, **NHTRANSFER.ORG** also provides information about the Transfer Connections Program, which is open to community college students who are planning to transfer to a 4-year state school in New Hampshire.
