

NHTI – CONCORD’S COMMUNITY COLLEGE NURSING ASSOCIATE DEGREE TRANSFER POLICY



Advanced Standing Transfer into NHTI’s Nursing Associate Degree program:

Advanced Standing Transfer students who have successfully completed a Nursing Fundamentals course (the equivalent to NURS 115C: Nursing I) at an accredited college may apply for consideration for placement into NURS 116C or NURS 117C for Spring semester enrollment only. Admission of Advanced Standing Transfer students is contingent upon space availability and satisfying the Admissions criteria outlined below.

Students admitted for Advanced Standing will need to complete all remaining degree coursework, including NURS 116C: Nursing IIA, NURS 117C: Nursing IIB, and NURS 215C: Nursing III, as well as any liberal arts courses not transferred. Students may enroll in liberal arts and science courses at NHTI prior to admission to the nursing program; however, enrollment in those courses does not guarantee acceptance into the nursing program. Transfer credit is determined by the Admissions Department in consultation with the Nursing Department based on course congruence, grade earned, and length of time since completion.

To be considered, an applicant must:

- Have successfully completed a Nursing Fundamentals course with a minimum course grade of a C or higher in the past academic year (i.e., the Fall or Spring semester preceding the application deadline).
- Successfully complete the Assessment Technology Institute (ATI): Fundamentals of Nursing Examination with a Proficiency Level of II or better. This would need to be completed at the exam session administered by NHTI approximately one week prior to the application deadline. - Submit a Success Plan to the Nursing department; available online at: <https://www.nhti.edu/nursing-success-plan/>.
- Have successfully completed ALL first semester non-nursing co-requisite courses with a minimum grade of a C or higher, prior to beginning second semester classes; specifically, English Composition, Introduction to Psychology, and Anatomy & Physiology I with lab.
- Submit a letter of “good standing” from prior Nursing Program Department Head.
- Submit a paper-based Application for Admission (available at the Admissions Office or online at https://www.nhti.edu/wp-content/uploads/2020/09/NHTI_Application_2020.pdf) which indicates that the applicant is applying as an “Advanced Standing Transfer” student into the Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) program, and ALL official high school and college transcripts.

All application materials must be on file in the Admissions Office no later than October 1st to be considered for the Spring semester start. It is the student’s responsibility to ensure these requirements are complete prior to the deadline.
