

INTERIM TRAVEL GUIDANCE DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Date: Aug. 3, 2020

Purpose: The purpose of this memorandum is to provide NHTI students current travel information as the situation is evolving with the rapid increase of community transmission of COVID-19 in several areas domestically in the U.S. **This guidance will change frequently and rapidly as the situation changes.**

Students should be aware of the following travel restrictions and the impacts it has on if you should self-quarantine and not come to CCSNH/NHTI property.

- Guidance from NHDHHS states that the following individuals should quarantine upon arrival in New Hampshire:
 - “NH residents or out-of-state visitors traveling to/from areas outside of New England (Vermont, Maine, Massachusetts, Connecticut, or Rhode Island) need to self-quarantine for the first 14 days of any intended stay in NH after travel (starting from the last day of their travel outside New England). This recommendation is irrespective of the mode of transportation for travel (public vs. private transportation).”
- Guidance from Emergency Order #52 Exhibit B Section O: Amateur and Youth Sports. Business Process Adaptations. Section 4:
 - “No teams/groups/athletes other than from New England are allowed at the competitive sporting events, training sessions, or practices in New Hampshire.” There are some limited exceptions to this.
- Students currently living in on campus housing or planning on attending a summer in person class/activity shall adhere to all travel restrictions outlined including: Travel to Level 3 countries, Emergency Order guidance, NHDHHS domestic travel on public conveyances guidance and domestic travel by personal vehicle to states currently identified as an entire state or region of state experiencing widespread ongoing transmission and requires the student to:
 - If living on campus, to quarantine in the designated quarantine Residence Hall for fourteen (14) days upon return.
 - If living off campus and attending in person activity to not come campus for 14 days upon return.
 - Communicate with Residence Life, Athletics Coach and/or professors as appropriate, who shall forward information to the Director of Campus Safety.

International Travel

Current countries with Level 3 travel restrictions on entry into the United States: Brazil, China, Iran, European Schengen Region (Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Monaco, San Marino, Vatican City), the United Kingdom and Ireland.

All other countries have a Level 3 Travel warning but are without restriction. The CDC recommends that travelers avoid all nonessential travel to all global destinations.

Cruise Ship and River Cruise Travel: The CDC has issued a Level 3 Travel Notice for all cruises worldwide. <https://wwwnc.cdc.gov/travel/notices/warning/coronavirus-cruise-ship>
