The New Hampshire Dual Admission Program FAQ

Which schools participate in this program?

The NH Dual Admission program is designed for students who want to complete an associate degree at NHTI and continue into a Bachelor's program at one of the University System of New Hampshire's (USNH's) public 4-year institutions: Granite State College, Keene State College, Plymouth State University, UNH-Durham and UNH-Manchester.

How do I apply?

Once accepted into NHTI, you'll meet with an advisor to go over the program and sign an advising agreement and program opt-in form ([available online](#)). This ensures you're aware of the program details. You'll receive advising on what courses you should register for based on your intended major at the USNH institution you plan to attend for your bachelor's. Plan to opt-in before completing 16 credits; i.e., before completing your second semester at NHTI. You'll be guaranteed entry to a USNH school with the completion of your AA or AS degree and a cumulative 2.5 grade point average. Granite State will work with students who achieve a 2.0 or better.

What is the tuition?

You'll pay NHTI tuition and fees while taking courses at NHTI. Once you graduate, you'll then pay the tuition and fees of the USNH school to which you've transitioned. This means you can earn a bachelor's degree from USNH and save a lot of money along the way! Financial aid eligibility is the same whether you are in the N.H. Dual Admission program.

Am I restricted in what program/major/courses I can enroll?

The program is generally designed for liberal arts majors in USNH schools; however, many majors have specific transfer pathways in place with USNH schools or are open to students participating in this program. Admission to certain majors will be dependent upon meeting major-specific GPA and course requirements above the 2.5 GPA requirement. Some highly

competitive programs (Nursing, Meteorology, Occupational Therapy, etc.) may not accept external transfer candidates at all. Other transfer pathways to USNH may be more appropriate for your intended major. Your advisor will assist you in deciding which transfer option is best for you.

And I don't have to fill out a new application when I am ready to transition?

Correct! You transition to the USNH institution by submitting an "intent-to-enroll" form to the USNH institution. No transfer application or fee is required. Ask your advisor about the deadline for submission of this form.

Will all of my credits transfer?

To be eligible for transfer, the courses must be applicable toward the specific major for which you're applying, and you must earn a grade of C or better. Courses for developmental credit (i.e., high school-level mathematics) would be for institutional credit at NHTI only; this is why it's so important to work with your advisor to plan your pathway.

I have Running Start and AP credits from high school. Will these count in the N.H. Dual Admission program?

Running Start courses are part of your community college transcript; as long as the course fits into the transfer pathway for the degree, it'll be considered for transfer credit. Each USNH institution has its own policy regarding AP credits, so be sure to review that information with your advisor.

What if my GPA falls below a 2.5 by the time I'm ready to transfer?

Eligibility is contingent upon meeting the minimum GPA of 2.5. If you fall below the required GPA threshold, you'll need to speak with the USNH institution to discuss alternative options to transfer.
