## Lynx fall in rematch to Knights 71-68

HAVERHILL, MA — **Sean Riley** (Washington, DC) registered a double-double with 14 points and 12 rebounds, but it was not enough as the Lynx fell to the Knights by a 71-68 final on Wednesday night.

NHTI trailed the whole night cutting down an early 14-point lead down to three heading into halftime. In the final minutes, the Lynx cut the lead to one multiple times before being down by three with 12 seconds to go. NHTI came up short on a three-point attempt to hoist Northern Essex CC to its first win of the season.

**Riley** did most of his damage early in the game contributing 14 points (4-8 FG, 2-4 3-FG, 4-6 FT), 12 rebounds and five assists before leaving due to an injury. **Shaquille Barrett** (Houston, TX) tallied 14 points (4-10 FG, 2-5 3-FG, 4-6 FT), 12 rebounds, four assists and three steals, while **Donavan Miller** (Detroit, MI) added 14 points (4-13 FG, 2-5 3-FG, 4-8 FT) and a pair of assists.

Other notable performances for NHTI include **Donovan Rodriguez** (Philadelphia, PA) (10 points, five rebounds and three steals) and **Sean Menard** (Chichester, NH) ( eight points, two rebounds, two assists, and two blocks).

Luis Parilla led the Knights with 13 points (4-9 FG, 0-2 3-FG, 5-5 FT).

For the team statistics NECC shot 36.8% from the floor while adding 10 triples edging NHTI who shot 36.1% with eight made threes. The Lynx outrebounded the Knights 47-39 while the Knights

controlled the turnover battle forcing 20 turnovers while the Lynx forced 18 turnovers.

NHTI will next suit up for an intrasquad scrimmage on Saturday before facing off with Fisher college on March 3<sup>rd</sup>.
