### In Recognition of Hispanic Heritage Month Did you know??

\*Hispanic Heritage Month begins on Sep. 15 because it coincides with the national independence days for many Latin American countries.

\*The U.S. Hispanic population reached 60.6 million in 2019, according to Pew Research Center. Hispanic Americans are the nation's second-fastest-growing racial or ethnic group after Asian Americans.

\*Four out of five Latinos are U.S. citizens as of 2018, per Pew Research Center. This includes people born in the U.S. and its territories, those born abroad to American parents, and immigrants who have become naturalized citizens.

\*The fastest population growth among Latino Americans is from people with origins in the Dominican Republic, Venezuela, Honduras, and Guatemala.

NHTI is committed to providing our students with access to mental health resources.
