## Wings of Knowledge: Digging into Native History in New Hampshire


**When?** November 2nd from 3:00pm-4:00pm



NHTI Health Services provides a full range of primary care, referral, and educational services at no cost to NHTI students. We offer initial diagnosis and treatment for a broad spectrum of illnesses and injuries and appropriate follow-up care. We are located in the Student Center (SC 103), and are open Monday - Friday, 8:00am - 4:30pm while school is in session. Office walk-in hours may vary to meet the needs of our community and therefore appointments are highly recommended. Nurse Practitioner visits are by appointment only.

NHTI is committed to providing our students with access to mental health resources. This includes access to a Student Assistance Program (SAP) provided by Kepro and free confidential student counseling services (SCS) by licensed mental health professionals in the area and other supports 24/7, 365 days a year. Kepro's services are confidential and you are provided with up to 6 counseling sessions per incident per year at no cost. In addition NHTI offers in-person and zoom short term counseling services.
