What Is a Dental Hygienist?

A dental hygienist is a licensed dental professional registered with a state dental board. They are healthcare professionals who work independently or alongside dentists and other dental professionals to provide full oral health care. They have the training and education to focus on and specialize in the prevention of oral diseases. Dental hygienists also:

- Perform dental cleanings; remove plaque, tartar, and stains from teeth; and provide oral hygiene instructions
- Take x-rays
- Apply fluoride and sealants
- Counsel patients on nutrition for oral health

What Is a Dental Assistant?

Dental assistants are members of the dental team who support the dental operator in providing more efficient dental treatment. Dental assistants provide patients help with oral hygiene skills, prepare the patient for treatment, assist during procedures, record patient notes, and schedule appointments. Dental assistants also:

- Maintain infection control
- Communicate with and calm patients
- After training, perform additional duties such as taking x-rays, polishing teeth, placing sealants, performing fluoride treatments, pouring study models, making temporary crowns, and more!
